## Introduction

In the Configuration > Cache section you can configure your Cache settings.

### Updating Use Cache

1. Go to the Admin Panel and click the **Configuration** link.
2. Then, select the **Cache** item.
3. Since the **Use Cache** item is highlighted, click the **Edit** button on the right.

- Tick the **True** button to set up use of caching features. The whole information about user's activities on website will be stored in cache files. This will save the user's time during subsequent visits to the web-store – all the site images will be loaded much faster from the cache.
  - Tick the **False** button if you do not want to activate caching features.
3. Click the **Update** button.

## Updating Cache Directory

1. From the Admin Panel click the **Configuration** link and select the **Cache** item.
2. Select the **Cache Directory** item in the grid and click the **Edit** button on the right.
